







Progress 8 measure




Supporting your child

- ▶ 15th March Final Option Choices Form deadline



Things to be aware of

- ➤ You <u>must</u> choose at least 1 EBacc subject but the other 2 choices can be <u>any</u> other options subject including others in the EBacc group.
- Subjects may be over-subscribed.
- Some subjects may be undersubscribed and not run.
- Combinations of subjects may not fit together in the timetable.
- ► In these cases, we may have to offer alternative courses but we will speak to students on an individual basis - there will be no surprises in September 2019.
- ▶ This is why we ask for reserve options to be chosen.
